

What is a CPC?

CPCs often claim to be medical clinics, but their main goal is to persuade women not to get an abortion.

How do they do it?

Methods:

- Set up next to actual women's health clinics to confuse patients
- Make themselves look and feel like an actual women's health center
- Shame, harass, and lecture people into carrying a pregnancy to term
- Often funded with taxpayer dollars
- Promise support that may not actually be available
- Often include religious activities, such as prayer, during the visit

Common Myths that CPCs Spread that are NOT true

- 1. CPC Myth: "Abortion Causes Breast Cancer."
- 2. CPC Myth: "You'll probably never be able to have children again if you have an abortion now."
- 3. CPC Myth: "Condoms don't work."
- CPC Myth: "The abortion pill is dangerous."
- CPC Myth: "Abortion causes women permanent psychological and mental damage, including 'post-abortion syndrome."

- **6. CPC Myth:** "Birth control and the 'morning-after pill' cause abortions."
- 7. CPC Myth: "Abortions cost much more than carrying your baby to term."
- 8. CPC Myth: "You have plenty of time to make a decision. One-third of all pregnancies end in miscarriages anyway."

None of these statements are true. You deserve unbiased, factual medical information to help you make the decision best for you.
