Breaking the Supermajority

What is a supermajority?

- A 'supermajority' means that one party has enough legislative seats filled to override vetoes from the executive branch.
- In North Carolina, the Republican Party acheived the 60% representation needed for a super majority after Representative Tricia Cotham changed party membership mid-session.

What impact has the anti-abortion supermajority had in NC?

- Republican lawmakers have used the supermajority to push through a number of radical and unpopular pieces of legislation. These include...
 - A 12-week abortion ban.
 - Voter suppression bills that make voting more difficult and redraw maps to limit the electoral power of marginalized voters.
 - Anti-LGBTQ legislation including bans on discussions of gender and sexuality in classrooms and on trans youth competing in sports consistent with their identity.

How can we break the anti-abortion supermajority?

- First, we must vote in a governor who will be able to issue key vetoes and stop harmful and dangerous legislation from taking effect across our state.
- Second, we must elect pro-choice members of the House and Senate who will fight for our rights and priorities. It will only take a few seats to break this harmful supermajority.

How can you find information on House and Senate races?

- 1. Go to the NC State Board of Elections's Voter Search function and enter your information (https://www.ncsbe.gov/voting/sample-ballot).
- 2. Look under "Your Jurisdictions" to see your NC Senate and NC House districts.
- 3. Search those districts and "2024 election" to identify the candidates running.
- 4. Research their platforms, pay attention to their endorsements, and don't be afraid to call their offices to ask any questions.
